

Wheelchair Access

The Hunt Museum building is wheelchair accessible. The main entrance is level-access, and there is lift access to every floor.

For those arriving by car, there are two disability parking spaces at the back (Riverside) of the Museum. You can enter the Museum through the Café. Once inside, take the lift to Reception to purchase a ticket.

The museum's accessible toilet is located on the Lower Ground Floor.

There are accessible automatic doors when entering and exiting our Permanent Collection galleries. These doors should be opened using the wall mounted push buttons. Some wheelchair users may require assistance with manual double doors located throughout the Museum.

Our multisensory station with 3D printed touch objects and audio descriptions is located on entering the Permanent Collection, in the Prologue Room, on the First floor. It includes an electric desk which wheelchair users can adjust to their preferred height.

Different types of floor coverings are used around the Museum. Carpet is widely used in the main galleries along with some tile and wooden flooring. The museum's Reception area and public toilets are tiled. The Hunt Café has both wood laminate and flag stone flooring. The main workshop space in the Education Wing has a flag stone floor and the smaller multifunctional space off it, has a slip proof vinyl surface.
